## More recently we think about this as Fundamentalism


#### Why we can't get along with Iran

1935 Pahlavi dynasty turns Persia into Iran

Iran is our chief ally in Middle East in 50s and 60s

Shah Mohammad Reza Pahlavi
Gets rich off oil revenues post-WWII





Ayatollah Khomeini and devout Muslims oppose the Shah Shah's regime collapses in 1979

Replaces by an Islamic Republic

#### **The Iranian Hostage Crisis**

Carter allows the Shah into America for life-saving care

1979 Militants invade the U.S. embassy in Tehran 52 Americans taken hostage for over a year

1989 More moderate govt loosens Muslim control over freedoms in Iran

#### **Gamal Abdel Nasser**

Rises to power in 1956
2nd President of Egypt
Helped over throw monarchy
Ushered in Modernization



Biggest Success: Nationalization of Suez Canal

Biggest Failure: Lost War of Attrition with Israel in 1956



# Oh yeah, Nasser was a Socialist. We should probably talk about that...

- He promoted pan-Arabism
- 1958 Officially united with Syria:

Forming United Arab Republic

- Hoped to build a union of all Arab States
- Some are skeptical, why that might be?
- Good News: Suffrage for Women comes during this period

#### **Anwar Sadat**



"Open-Door" Policy: increased western capitalist investment in Egypt, such as tourism, baking and fast food industries among others

Gets the Sinai Peninsula back from Israel & sets up diplomatic relations

1981 - Killed by Islamic Fundamentalists

1982 - Hosni Mubarak takes over Takes Iraq's side in Iran-Iraq War
